

SURVEY DESCRIPTION

Situated in the Township of Jackson, County of Wyandot, State of Ohio, and being a part of the Southeast Quarter of Section Four (4) of Township Three (3) South, Range Twelve (12) East and being more particularly bounded and described as follows:

Commencing at a railroad spike found in the Centerline of State Route 53 at the intersection of the Centerline of Township Highway 84, thence North $89^{\circ}52'00''$ East, along and with the Centerline of S.R. 53, a distance of 326.48 feet to a P.K. nail found 30 feet north of an existing, concrete, State Highway Right-of-Way Monument;

Thence South $90^{\circ}00'00''$ East, along and with the aforesaid Centerline of S.R. 53 and the South Line of the Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 4, and passing over a railroad spike set at 68.37 feet, a distance of 330.87 feet to the place of beginning, being 0.61 feet south of a found P.K. nail;

Thence North $00^{\circ}00'00''$ East along and with an existing property line, and passing over iron pins found at approximately 30.6 feet and ~~155.7~~ feet, a distance of 165.95 feet to a point;

Thence North $90^{\circ}00'00''$ West along and with an existing property line and parallel with the Centerline of S.R. 53 and the South Line of the Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 4, a distance of 262.50 feet to a point being approximately 10.8 feet north of an iron pin found;

Thence North $00^{\circ}00'00''$ East a distance of 67.93 feet to an iron pin set;

Thence South $90^{\circ}00'00''$ East and parallel with the Centerline of S.R. 53 and the South Line of the Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ Section 4, a distance of 372.50 feet to an iron pin set;

Thence South $00^{\circ}00'00''$ West and passing over an iron pin set at 203.88 feet, a distance of 233.88 feet to a railroad spike set in the aforesaid Centerline of S.R. 53 and the South Line of the Southeast $\frac{1}{4}$ section 4;

Thence North $90^{\circ}00'00''$ West along and with the aforesaid Centerline and South Line of Section 4 a distance of 110.00 feet to the place of beginning.

Containing 1.00 acres of land more or less and subject to legal highways, easements, and restrictions of record.
